

# TEENS WORKSHOPS FALL 2020 Registration Package

Thank you for your interest in Teens Workshops with Continuing Studies at Emily Carr! Workshops are open to students ages 15-18 with an interest in art. No experience is required.

Please be sure to complete **all of the forms in this package** to ensure your registration can be processed. **PAYMENT** must be paid in full **at the time of registration**. Program fees include instruction. Due to the online nature of the program this year, students participating Teens Workshops + Weekend Intensives will be required to source their own supplies.

Students will need access to a computer to join the virtual classroom on BlueJeans and/or Zoom. It is recommended students also have access to a smartphone or tablet to document progress of their work and share with the class.

Please be sure your *primary email address is one that is active and checked regularly.* This will be our primary method of communication with you.

#### ECU's Withdrawal and Refund Policy:

Refunds or tuition waivers, minus an administrative charge of \$35 per course, will be given if notification of withdrawal is received seven or more calendar days before the start of the course. No refund will be given if notification of withdrawal is received less than seven full calendar days before the start of the course. Get your creative energy flowing with this exciting design intensive! Surface design has many applications including textiles, interior design, home décor, craft-based and editorial projects. Through a variety of exercises, you will explore creative ideation strategies, composition and colour theory, and pattern development. Learn to hand draw and prototype repeating patterns that can be applied to any number of surfaces or projects. By the end of the course, you will have developed a set of skills that will be useful in many industries and creative pursuits, including interior design, printmaking, textile design, fashion design and illustration.

Develop your life drawing and observational skills in this intensive two-day workshop. Through a range of exercises, students will use gesture, line, proportion, composition, volume, and form as a foundation for their drawings while building confidence in their technical abilities and individual style.





Learn how to hand-weave your own tapestry on a frame loom. This hands-on workshop will introduce you to the art of woven tapestry. You will learn fundamental weaving techniques, from selecting the materials to building a frame loom, and creating woven designs. You will explore various techniques of plain weave, slit tapestry, hatching, shape-building, and knotting, as well as finishing techniques. By the end of the program, you will have developed an awareness of the creative potential of tapestry and textile arts.
