

# HOW MUCH WILL IT COST TO STUDY AT EMILY CARR UNIVERSITY?

This budget estimation tool helps predict costs to study as an undergraduate student at Emily Carr University for the **2018/2019** academic year.

- These totals are based on 15 credits per semester. Some programs may require that you take more than 15 credits in a semester.
- Students may opt out of health plans provided they prove adequate equivalent coverage.
- Books and supplies costs can vary widely by student, by year and by your choice of art materials.
- Tuition, fees and dates subject to change annually. Prospective students should anticipate increased tuition and fees for the 2019/20 academic year.

This budget estimate is based on average costs. Vancouver is an expensive city to live in and costs can vary widely depending on if you are living on your own or in shared accommodations. The following estimates are very conservative so when you do your own budget, be sure to budget for your own circumstance.
